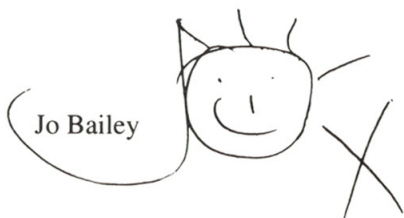

TOURNEWS

Although there aren't any dates confirmed as yet, I can tell you that the tour will start in late May. DM have decided on a change in the usual tour routine, so, they'll begin in the U.S rather than Europe. Dave has promised "a few surprises". European fans won't have to wait too long for Depeche 'happenings' as the band will be doing plenty of promotional stuff prior to the tour!

The new DM album, as yet untitled, will be released in February. DM have just returned from PUK studios in Denmark. Around ten songs have been recorded so far, and Depeche will be in the studio in London till at least Christmas, as they want to record some more tracks for future 'B' sides and mixes. A single will be released in the New Year, called 'Enjoy The Silence' - the 'B' side has yet to be decided.

You may have heard Bruno Brookes on TOTP (7th Sept) say that DM had "An album out in October called 'Wild', and a tour very soon!" - WRONG!! I don't know where he got his information from, but that particular piece of news refers to another band, with a member who used to be in Depeche! (Now, who on earth could that be?) He also wrote in his 'Number 1' magazine column that we are organising a 'fun-run' for fanclub members - NO WE'RE NOT! I'm an incredibly lazy person and that is the last thing I'd do!

The video for 'PERSONAL JESUS' was filmed in Almeria, Spain, in a 'Mexican' village where Clint Eastwood's 'Spaghetti Westerns' were made. 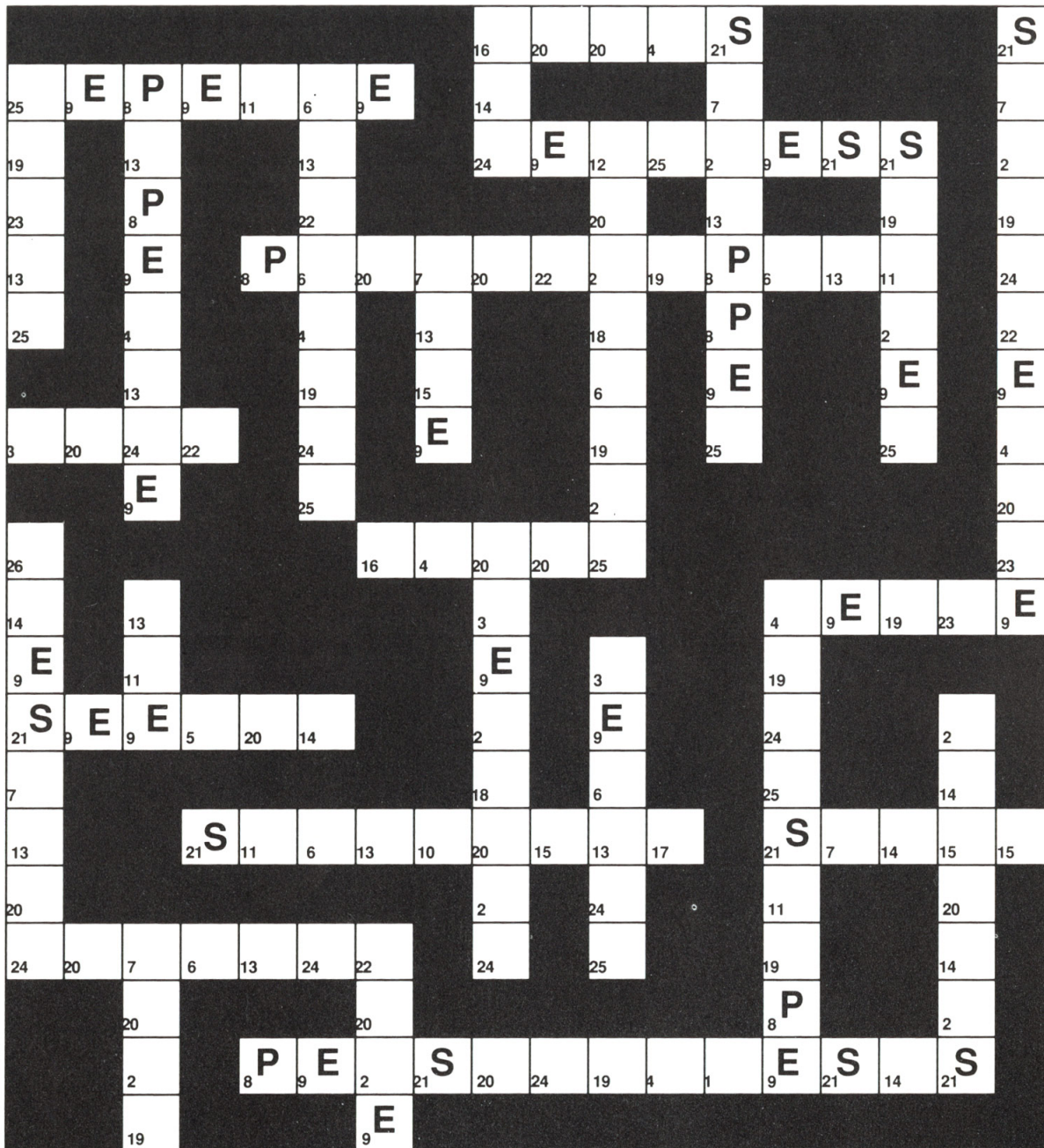
As you've no doubt seen from the cover photo, this year's 'SUPERFAN' has already been presented with his award, a gold '101' disc, complete with a plaque saying 'Presented to: Rob Latchford, Depeche Mode's number one fan 1989'. Rob, from Essex, was picked out of hundreds of entries, when he sent in two large folders packed with photographs and information about his exploits as a 'raving' Depeche Mode fan! His entry was in two parts, the first mainly features the 'BLACK CELEBRATION' Tour, with a few very old DM gig photos thrown in for good luck, and the second, the 'MUSIC FOR THE MASSES' Tour, although Rob has been following DM practically from the beginning! He's been to a total of 46 DM concerts over the years, in the UK, Europe and the USA. Below is a very small section of Rob's written entry. This, combined with the hundreds of photos he sent, I'm sure that no-one would dispute his 'Superfan' title!:

PART ONE:

Paris here we come! - We arrived a few days early to get used to where we were and find the concert hall. Paris is a large enough place when you're lost and it was quite difficult trying to find the concert venue! When we did find the place we thought the concert would be held it turned out to be wrong! Luckily there were posters saying the concert was on at Bercy instead (wherever that was!) so we set off again in search of it.....The concert that night at Bercy was amazing! I had never seen a place like it before. Half of it was underground and didn't look finished. Inside it was so large, there was a place where you could all stand in front of the stage, so we all ran down and somehow managed to get in the front row. The atmosphere was great. There was some pushing and shoving, but it was worth being a little bit crushed. After the concert we went back to the hotel (we were staying in the same hotel as DM!) and waited for the band to tell them what a good time we all had!

This is only a very small part of Rob's account of his trips to see DM. If you want to hear more, I suggest you dig him out during the next tour !

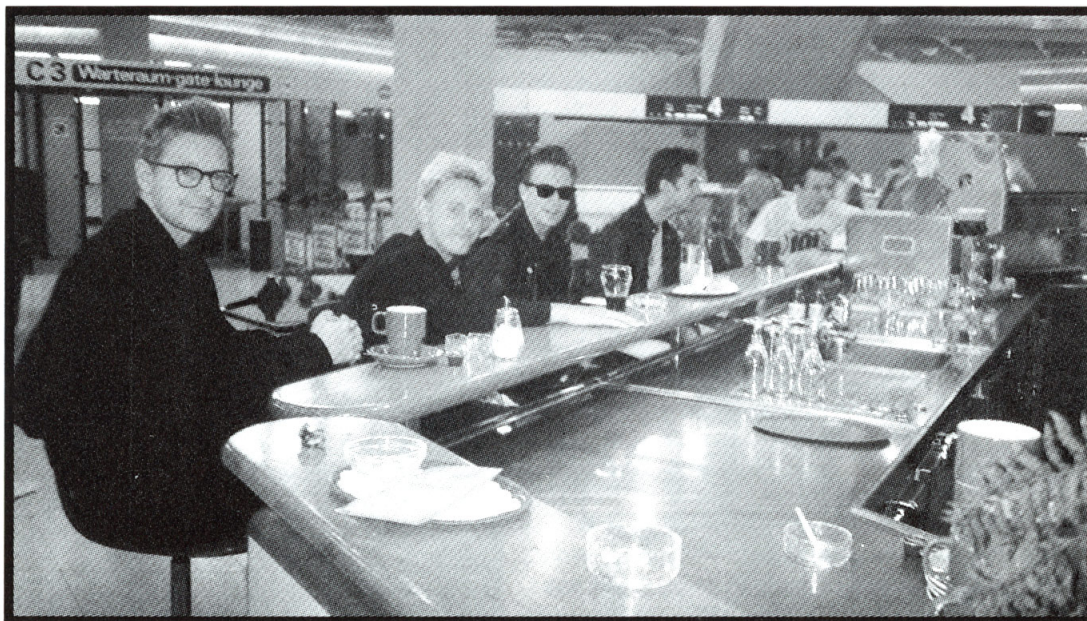
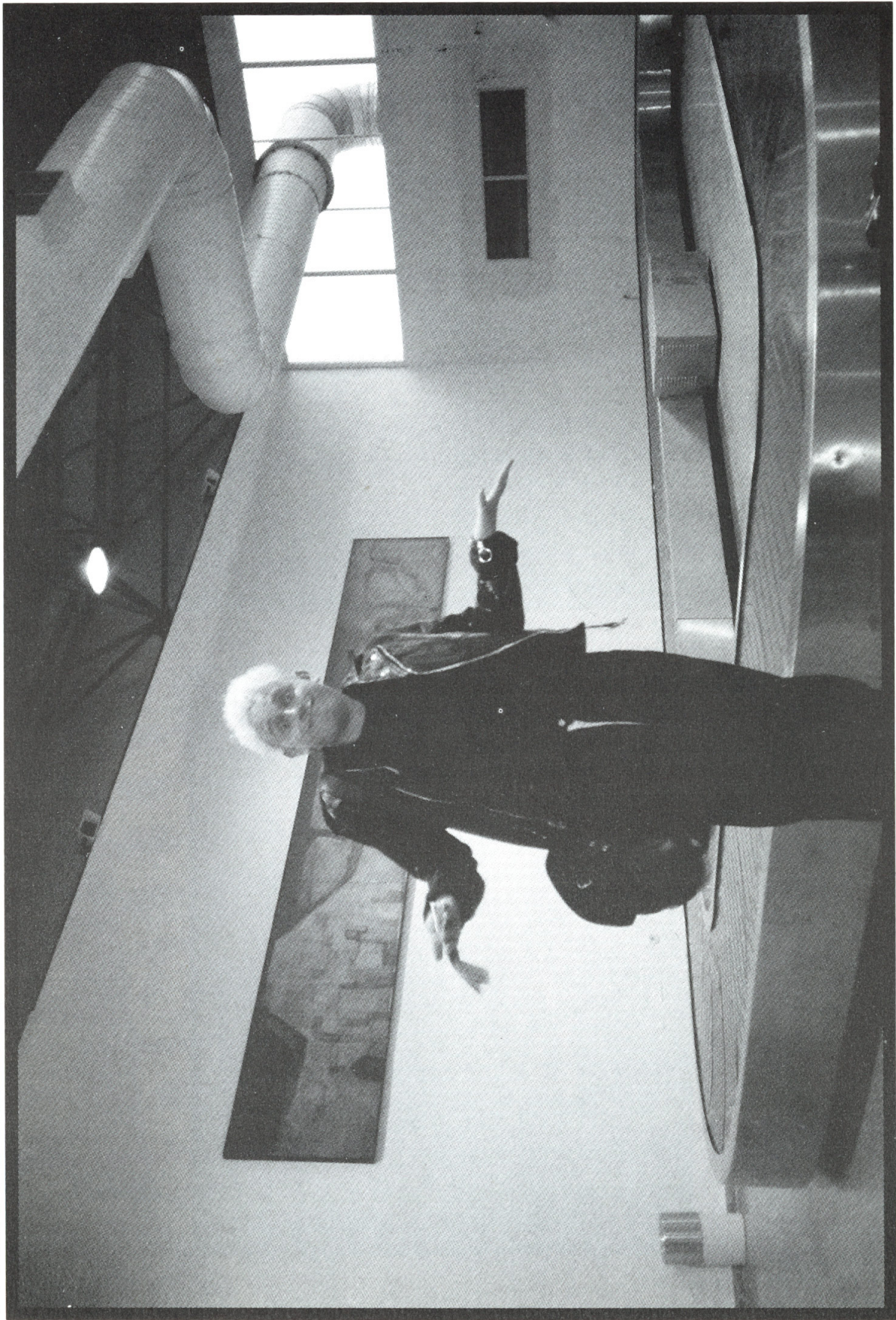

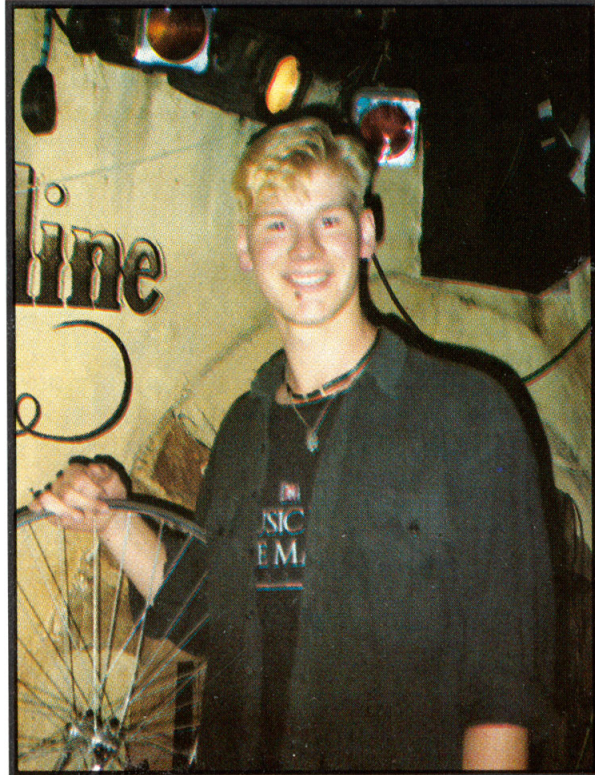
